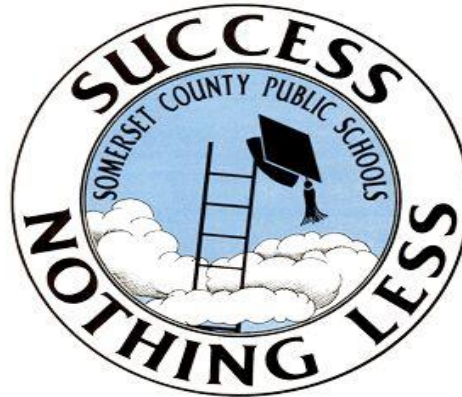


ServSafe Food Protection Manager Certification Program

The ServSafe Food Protection Manager Certification Program was developed by the National Restaurant Association. It is designed to meet today's food safety challenges and fulfill state requirements for certified food protection managers. Updated with the 2017 FDA food codes the class will enhance your knowledge of the principles of safety and sanitation in the food service field. The class is 16 hours long and concludes with a two hour examination. Graduates who pass the exam will receive certificate of certification. **The Instructor for this program will be award winning chef Jim Washington. Mr. Washington has been an instructor at the Career and Technology Center for ten years.**

The way the program works is simple. Obtain an application by downloading it from the J.M. Tawes website or the Somerset County Public Schools Adult Education Website. Complete the application and return it to Princess Anne One Stop, Marion School, and Somerset County Public Schools Office by September 7, 2017. Space is limited to twelve students.
